Processing instructions

The PVA–release film is a film forming release lacquer, which is dissolved in a mixture of alcohol and water. The film, which develops after the evaporation of the solvent mixture, is smooth and high gloss, non – toxic and furthermore unsoluble in nearly all organic solvents. Therefore the release lacquer acts like a barrier against agressive chemicals, so that the moulds are protected. The PVA–release film is applied with a soft brush, cloth or sponge and is dry after approx. 15-30 minutes.

After the demoulding process the release film can be peeled off like a foil. Possibly remaining residues can easily be removed with water.
